- Over 3,400 students have participated in the UofR Salzburg Program since 1960
- It is the U of R's only university run study abroad program
- Faculty are mostly Austrian. The director and one visiting faculty member are from the U of R

  - Allows student to study away for two semesters - first semester in Salzburg

  - National Study Away Scholarships
  - Activity funding and high need support

# Advising Tips

**It's never too early to ask your students about study away plans!**

- Advantage of being able to plan ahead for LAIs that they will earn abroad.
- Easier planning for highly structured majors: Math, Biology, Physics, etc.
- Rolling admissions helps students who make last minute decision to study away.
- Helpful for students who are hesitant about living and learning abroad.
- Costs same as Redlands tuition but includes meals, entrance to cultural events, and program travel.

- Salzburg, Austria is centrally located.
- Lots of travel opportunities for students on weekends.
- It is amazing to watch them grow into confident world travelers!
