Internship Description:

Sustainable Claremont (SC) is a community-backed 501(c)3 non-profit organization in Claremont, CA that engages people in education and action to create a more sustainable community – environmentally, socially, and economically – in Claremont and beyond."

Sustainable Claremont has received grant funding from Clean Power Alliance and CALPINE to conduct research on clean energy and translate that research into education and outreach efforts to better inform the public. In alignment with that goal, we are seeking **two paid interns** to take on research topics that will be of interest to our network, provide valuable and insightful information, and to identify key strategies to deliver that information to the community.

Interns will be under the joint supervision of Sustainable Claremont staff and Professor Rountree.

- Students who have taken significant environmental coursework, particularly coursework related to energy resources, climate change, and environmental planning are strongly encouraged to apply

- Research into local power procurement, how it varies from community to community, what the slate of power generation currently is and how it's projected to change over time
- Content analysis

outreach on research findings. This will require developing a poster to provide education and outreach

- Optional: virtual, recorded talk detailing research findings that will be posted on Sustainable Claremont's website and youtube channel
- Students who have taken significant environmental coursework, particularly EVST 210: Energy and the Environment, EVST 433: Climate Science, and/or EVST 413: Responses to Climate Change are strongly encouraged to apply
